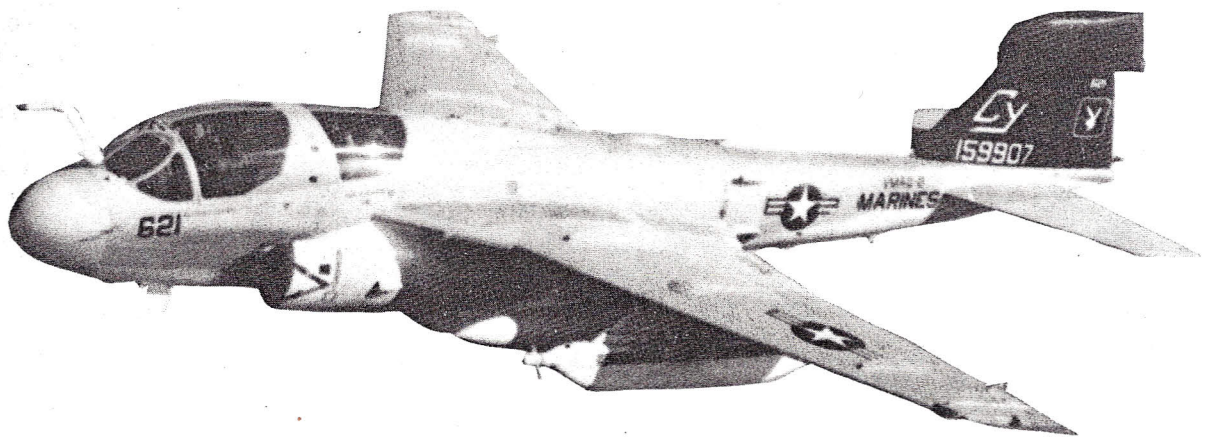

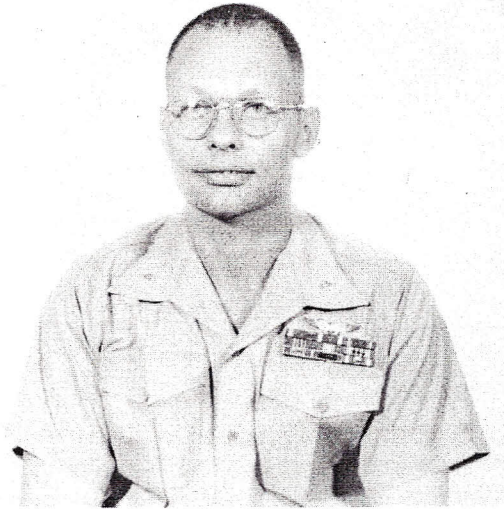
## Officer In Charge

## Asst. Officer In Charge

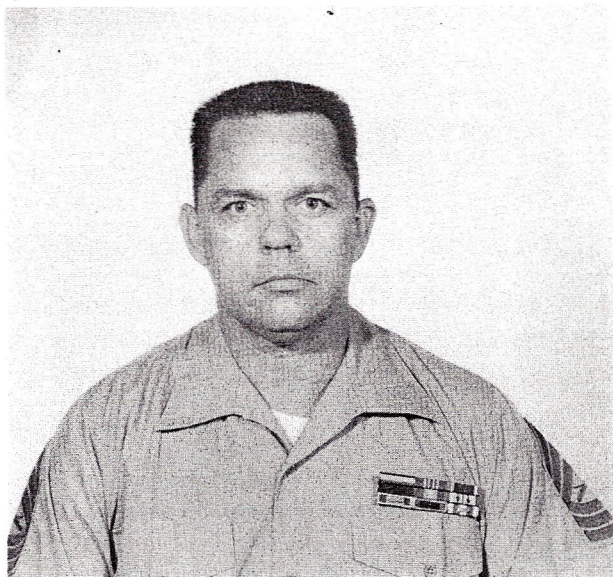


Maj. N. K. Robison

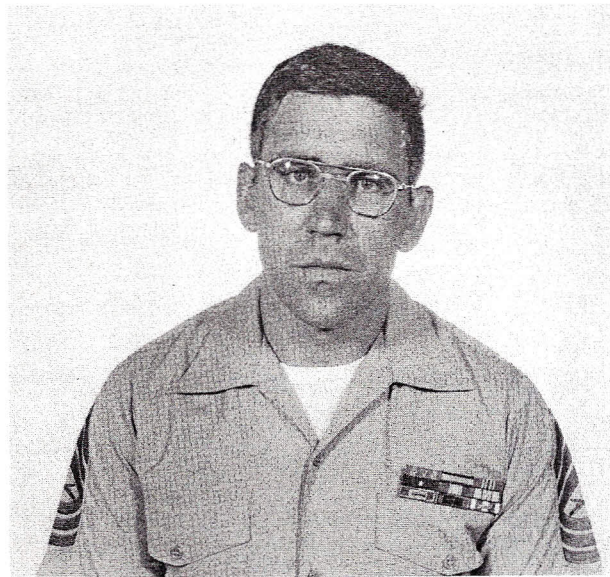
## First Sergeant

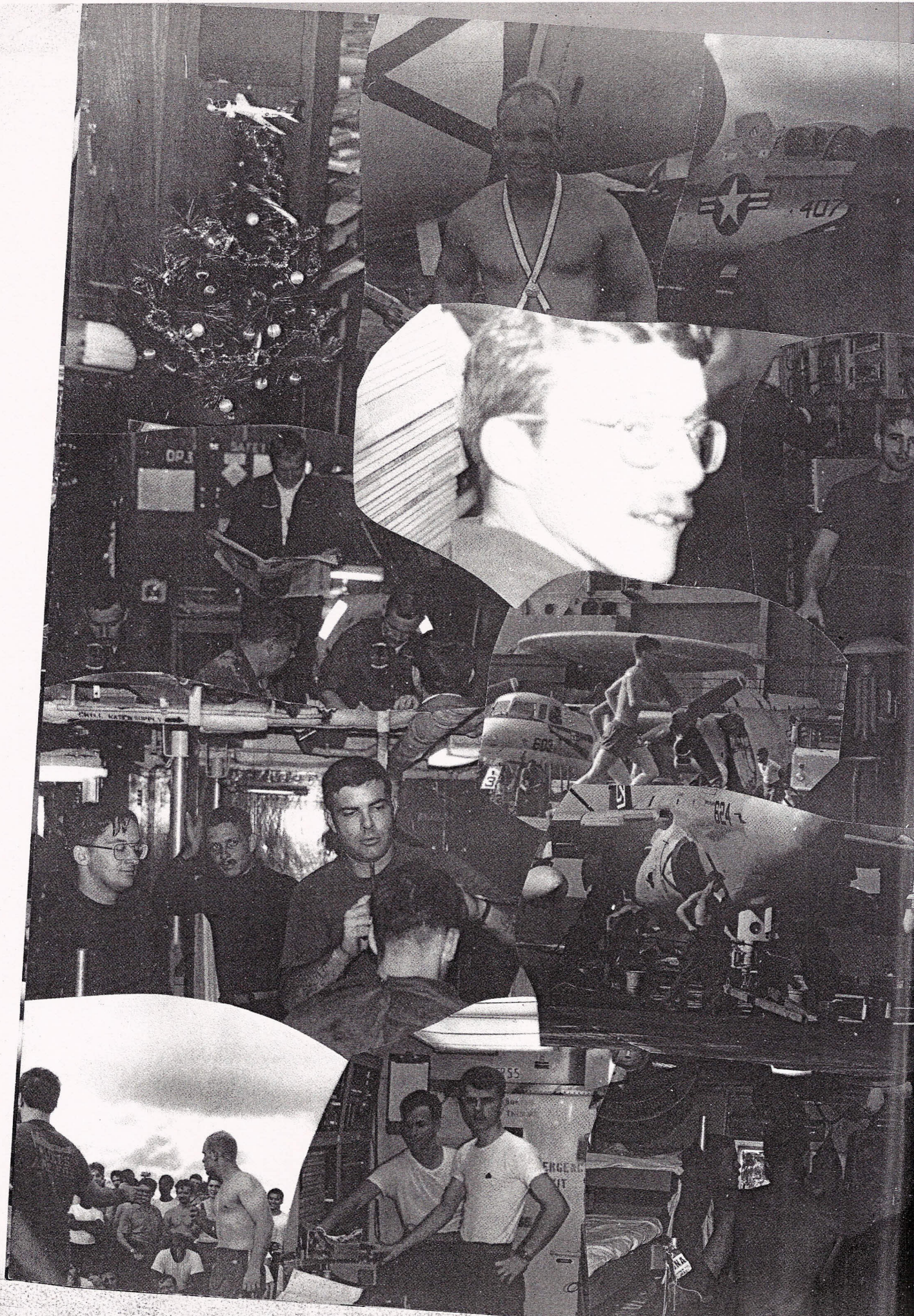




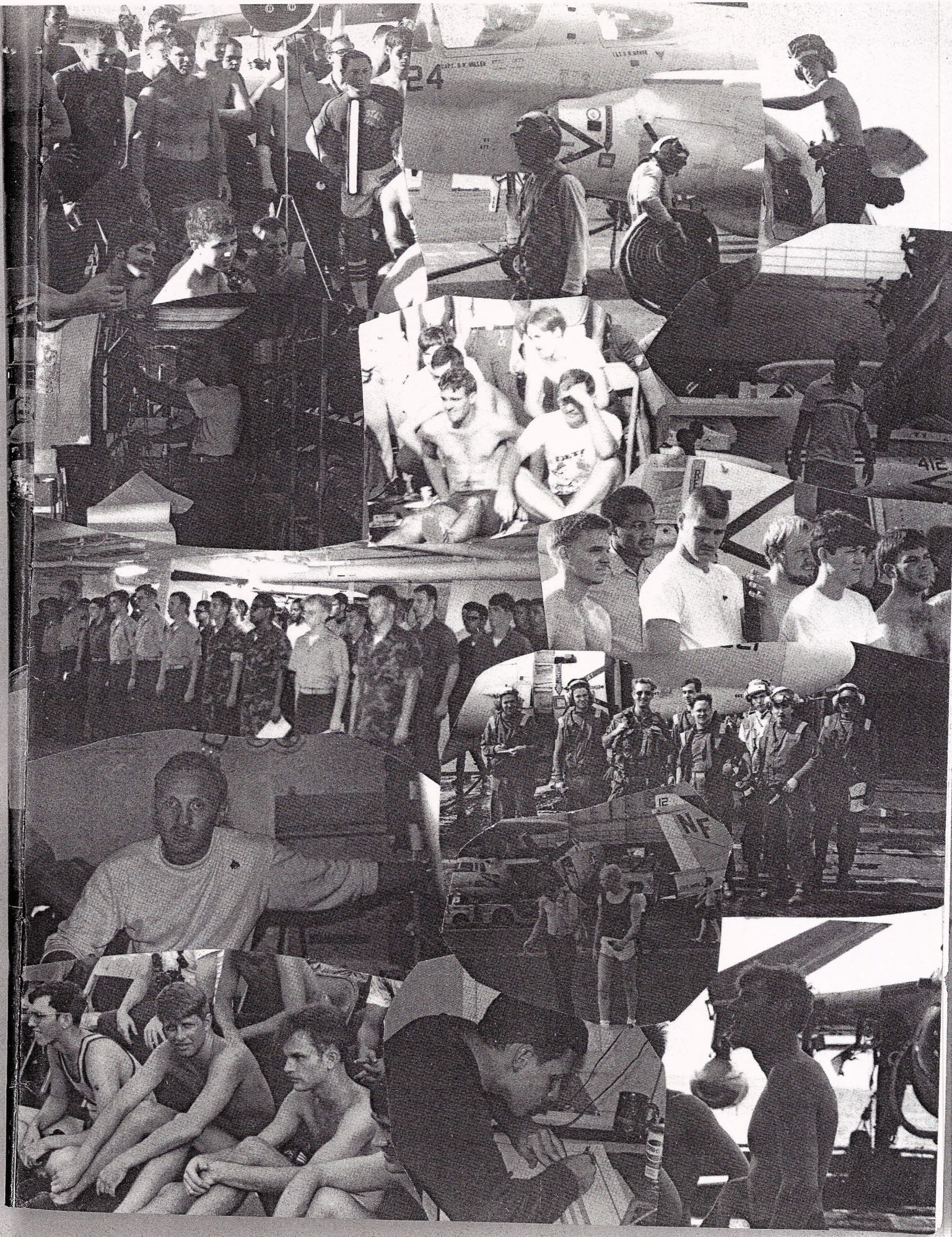














YOU KNOW YOU HAVE BEEN IN THE INDIAN OCEAN TOO LONG WHEN . . .

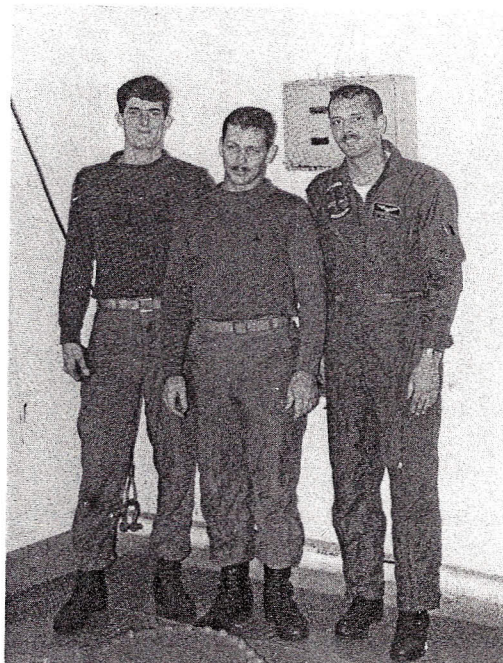
